



A SPECIAL COLLECTION THAT AIMS AT LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT IN FRENCH

Books by Lucille Maurice and Janine Tougas

These tools and stories suitable for Kindergarten to Grade 3 addresses all of the child's developmental needs and are a great supplement to French programs. The collection's approach is play-centered, interactive and fun. The characters of Paul and Suzanne become real little friends for the pupil, who can then create a real affective attachment to the French language.

The collection offers 200 simple stories in 20 big books (each sentence of the stories is supported by an illustration). Each big book presents a general theme (e.g. winter, summer, circus, toys) and ten categories of vocabulary: body parts, clothing, movements, food, family, temperature, colors, emotions, space (in front, behind, etc.) and times of the day.



It depicts how the buffalo used to provide for food, shelter, clothing, hunting equipment and many other necessities for the survival of the Prairie peoples. The book emphasizes how prevalent this animal has been in the area, where it roamed in herds of 30 to 50 millions, how important it still is, and what great respect it deserves.






A guide titled **Esprit Apprenant** ("Learning Spirit") also completes the Wabanaki Collection.

This guide is designed for parents or educators who wish to further discuss the books' topics with the young readers or to accompany their reading. The guide was developed by specialists in literature and social sciences, and has been validated by Aboriginal education leaders, so that it stays true to their philosophies.

The great pedagogical potential of these books lies in the reflections and activities that they propose on the Algonquian values, traditions, philosophies, family mores, identity and language. Non-Aboriginal children can use this opportunity to deepen their knowledge about these communities, and to open their mind to other cultures.




Against all odds, a lobster volunteers to fight it! And the fight then transforms the surrounding nature and landscape for generations to come.



DO YOU KNOW THE PROLIFIC ACADIAN AUTHOR DIANE CARMEL LÉGER?

Diane Carmel Léger grew up in New Brunswick, Eastern Canada. She wrote her first kids' novel when feeling homesick from living in Vancouver, British Columbia, at the westernmost end of the country. *La butte à Pétard* was named after a historic landmark near where she grew up. The novel takes place during the 1755 Acadian deportation, when tens of thousands of Acadians have been sent to scattered parts of the United States, but mainly to New England and Louisiana. This first book of a trilogy follows the characters of two teenagers who flee deportation and learn to survive in the wild.

Living in her hometown again in 2006, Carmel Léger wrote **Retour à la butte à Pétard**, literally "Back to Pétard's hillock". This second volume follows two Louisianan teenagers that are the descendants of Acadian deportees. The trilogy ends with **Échos de la butte à Pétard**, in which an American girl and an Acadian boy pursue an unordinary quest from one end of the continent to the other.

The 14/18 collection also has its very own website, zone1418.com, where reading enthusiasts can find summaries and information on all the titles in the collection, and where teachers can find educational worksheets that have been validated by educational consultants, to promote their use in the classroom.. These educational worksheets emphasize the identity construction of students and discuss topics such as knowledge and self-esteem, identity, community belonging and Francophone cultural referents. Another goal of these worksheets and books is to develop critical thinking in students and their ability to express themselves orally, in writing or through arts.






